Cyclist Badge

For most of this half term we have been concentrating on the Cyclist Badge. The Scouts have been shown how to do safety checks on their bikes including brakes and the correct seat adjustment.

We have also acquired 4 bikes for use by the Group. These were obtained from a local charity for a small donation. Two of the bikes have only required minor tlc to restore them to operational use. One of the bikes has had a new brake cable and is now up to scratch. The remaining bike when collected had no chain, no working gears and the brakes were missing some key parts. This is still a work in progress.

As part of the Cyclist Badge Requirement, the scouts need to take part in a 25 mile bike ride. This is something that we are clearly going to have to build up to. As a start we had a short bike ride along the Wirral Way.

The bike ride had an exciting start due to a seized wheel on the trailer. Hmmm nice smell of burning rubber! Most of the Scouts cycled to West Kirby and back from Caldy. A few die hards then went on to the visitors centre at Thurstaston, where we took shelter to avoid the worst of the torrential rain.

At the end of the ride we returned to the Scout Hut for a sleepover. The Scouts took part in a Scalectrix competition, had a chippy tea, and DVD.
