

From the District Commissioner

By the time you read this the Summer Break will be nearly over and you will be back to delivering the Scouting programme again, so it is probably an appropriate time to thank you all for what you do for the young people in our care. I hope that you are refreshed from the break and have recovered from Summer Camp.

Since I last "put pen to paper", bearing in mind that that was early June, a lot seems to have happened. Firstly there was the Cub Camp which was at Sandiway. There were only four Groups there which is about a quarter of the District, but those who were there seemed to be thoroughly enjoying the experience with a very full programme. The Leaders were also having a good time! That was on the Saturday. The next day I went to Hilbre Headquarters for a Big Breakfast where I had the opportunity to present the District's gift to Chris Carlson for her years of service as ADC Beavers, which I had been unable to do at the District AGM. The breakfast was a fundraising event and was a wonderful idea. It didn't do my weight any good though. Congratulations to Hilbre.

I also visited 6th Heswall to present the President's Prize which we had not been able to present at the AGM.

2nd West Kirby celebrated their 75th anniversary with two events. They had a ceremony down at the Marine lake where their new sailing craft were officially launched by Esther McEvey the local MP. She also presented some Chief Scouts Gold awards. Also Diana Beavan was there to launch three kayaks that the District had purchased out of a very generous donation Diana had made to the District. These kayaks will be used to train Leaders to a level where they can be assessed for a permit to take young people on the water Later that day there was a barbeque and fun activities plus a brief AGM.

It has been the AGM season, with 7th Moreton, 4th Heswall, 1st Newton, 3rd Heswall, 1st Frankby Greasby and Overchurch Upton all holding their AGMs. 2nd Greasby celebrated their 60th Anniversary with a fun day on their field and a barbeque. They too had managed to get Ester McVey to their event. This was later followed by the AGM.

Also during this period 4th Heswall had their Royal Navy Inspection with the RN Officer inspecting their skills on the water and how they looked after their equipment. This was followed later in the day with an inspection of the Group and the Patrols. It was a gruelling experience but they passed so continue with their Royal Navy Recognition. Congratulations to the Leaders and the Young People.

I was unable to attend the Backwoods Cooking as I had a rather nasty cough and I thought the smoke wouldn't help.

It was unfortunate that the Cubs Geo Cache event had to be cancelled due to lack of support. It is sad that when leaders have worked hard to put on a different event that all their hard work was to no avail. Hopefully their efforts will be available to put this on at some other date.

We were represented at Merseyside's 40th Anniversary event at the Liverpool Metropolitan Cathedral by the Explorers and a number of Leaders and Commissioners.

I have been pleased in this period that I have been able to visit the Cub Camp, 1st Newton Cub Camp at Hawarden, and Chamboree the Cheshire County International Jamboree. 4th Moreton and 1st

Thurstaston were there and although 75% of the campers were from the UK there were Scouts, Explorers and Guides from Egypt, Netherlands, Solvenia, USA, Denmark, Belgium and Ireland. Our Explorers were making friends with the Scouts from Slovenia while I was there.

I was able to visit all the activities that were on the site but not the off site activities. There were so many exciting things to do. What an opportunity for our Young People to experience an international event and have the range of activities that are available and what an easy event for the Leaders with no programme to plan and execute. I would recommend this to all Groups. It's four years before the next one so you have time to think about it.

We have got the District Executive's financial approval to run our own First Response, Safeguarding and Safety training courses. You will hear more about these shortly.

On an entirely different note I would like to congratulate our Editor, Eddie Snell and his wife Ann who have celebrated their Diamond Wedding Anniversary. They have been married as long as 2nd Greasby has existed!.
