1st Barnston on the City & Dam Trail

1st Barnston scouts followed straight on from their runs in the orienteering event with a Sunday hike, this time in north Cheshire. The trail took an 8-mile route on footpaths and the towpath of the Bridgewater Canal around Thelwall and Lymm.

Sunday weather was very different to Saturday's; it was wet! The weather forecaster's 'optimism' that the overnight rain would clear early morning was very misplaced as we set out from Grappenhall and at Thelwall we picked up the Transpennine Trail footpath (which we had cycled in our Mersey expedition 18 months ago).



[Thelwall claims to be the smallest city in England; it isn't as that title belongs to the City of London, however, it's also not a city. In 923 Edward the Elder, son of King Alfred, visited the area and for some time made it his residence with soldiers garrisoned there. He ordered a 'burh' (a barrier made from wooden stakes) to be built as a defence on the important crossing point of the Mersey. It was a mistranslation of this word 'burh', which means military fort (maybe with 'burgh', which means large town or city), which might have led to Thelwall wrongly being called a city.

City or not, the rain was relentless as we left Thelwall and headed for Lymm. The route into Lymm took us along the towpath of the Bridgewater Canal and led to a welcome stop for hot chocolate in the narrowboat café. The next part of the trail headed south along the banks of the Dam. The Dam is now the name given to the lake in Lymm but was originally the 'dam' built for the toll road that crossed the once small pool that was here. In time the name has transferred to the lake that grew from the dammed pool.



Finally, the sun came out – better late than never! - as we hiked through The Bongs (woodland) at the southern end of the Dam and then northwards to join the canal again, which was followed all the way back to Grappenhall.
