ISMAY ANNUAL REPORT SUMMER 2023

Overview

It has been an extremely busy and successful year for the Beavers and leaders of Ismay Colony. Our leader team has grown to include ABSL Bubbles (Rachel Phillips) who works alongside BSL Malak (Richard Morris) and ABSL Rainbow (Gemma Morris). Sessions are also supported by Scout helper India Morris and a rota of parent helpers.

Our 2022-2023 programme has been exciting and varied as always with all our Beavers being given the opportunity to try new experiences such as sailing and learn new skills such as how to look after and grow different plants. Our programme has focussed on providing fun sessions and encouraging all our Beavers to challenge themselves – and they have all loved it!

Attendance and Registrations

There are currently 24 Beavers registered with Ismay colony, and attendance is high.

This year, we have invested 12 new Beavers into Ismay colony; 3 of these have moved up from the 1st Thurstaston Squirrels dreds. We have also said goodbye to 9 of our Beavers, who have moved on to Cubs.

We are extremely proud that 12 of our Beavers have achieved their Chief Scouts Bronze Award. There are only a very small number of Beavers who have left us without having achieved the Chief Scouts Bronze Award, and these are all Beavers who have joined late (i.e. after the age of 6).

We are also pleased that ABSL Gemma Morris recently received her 5-year Service Award.

Programme

Among others, Ismay Beavers have worked on their navigator, communication, photographer, emergency aid and gardener badges this year. They have also been on a den-building expedition to Royden Park, a watersports experience at West Kirby Marine Lake, a 'chippy hike' from Thurstaston to West Kirby, a pottery-painting night at the Potting Shed in Hoylake and a visit to Heswall Fire Station.

Our programme has also included an international visit to Paris, which 2 Ismay Beavers attended, and a circus-themed sleepover at the Scout Hut. Our Beavers had a great time, and they were all extremely brave, especially considering that, for some of them, it was their first night away from home!

There are more nights away coming up: we are looking forward to our trip to Deiniolen in North Wales (this is a two-night camp, which will include visits to Greenwood Park and RSPB Conway); and summer camp (which is a two-night camp at Queen Charlotte's Wood).

The rest of our summer term programme will make the most of being outdoors in the good weather, and we are looking forward to planning another busy programme for 2023-2024.

Our second to last meeting of the term was a joint night with Fletcher Pack at “Wild Shore” in New Brighton. This was a fun night enjoyed by all.

Our last night of the term was spent at Thurstaston Country Park for a BBQ and sports day.

We had our Summer camp at PGL Boretton Park Shropshire. This was a joint camp with Fletcher Pack, Thor, Royden & Ismay Colonies and the Scouts.

This was a mix of adventurous water and land based activities as well as evening entertainment.

Some of the activities included raft building, Climbing, fencing, shooting, an assault course and some Cubs got very muddy, a camp fire and a disco.

We visited Blists Hill, which is a Victorian Town.

September 2022

Any interesting facts, such as their rank or something they did during the War.

They had to talk to the rest of the pack about them.

We attended remembrance parade at St Bart's along with the other sections.

As part of Parliament, Week Mayor Jeff Green visited us to talk about his roll of mayor and how the council works.

Cubs went to the Potting Shed in Hoylake and painted their own Ceramic Christmas tree.

This was a great night, and one to be repeated in the future.

We had a “Cubs got talent” night where they had the opportunity to perform their chosen talent in front of the rest of the pack.

December 2022

Both Cub packs went on a “Christmas Chippy Hike” along the Wirral Way from Thurstaston to West Kirby. Thank you to Bagheera for getting the Chips.

March 2023

Reed Pack visited the National Police Air Service base at Harwarden, to see the Police helicopter and to learn about the role of the helicopter, the Officers on board and the equipment they use. Due to the Helicopter breaking down Fletcher Pack did not visit the Site but Constable Beth attended the hut and gave the cubs a presentation and showed them videos from Police chases etc.

We had a fitness night.

Made Mother's day cards, which was led by young leaders.

Learnt how to look after their pets, and they earned their Pet carers badge.

The Cubs learned how to build, and light a fire to roast marshmallows on to make their S'mores. They each took it in turns to light the fire using a flint and steel and cotton wool. They all managed it, with success.

April 2023

The Summer term started with a pack holiday to the Old School Lodge in Deiniolen North Wales. We visited the Greenwood forest Park on the Saturday and RSPB Conway on the Sunday.

The Wednesday after the pack holiday we had a basic skill night.

We made Catapults and learnt Knots.

May 2023

We have had a "Team challenge night"

Tower building: Using only newspaper and tape they had to build the tallest tower possible that stands up by itself.

Candle lighting: The Cubs were provided with garden canes, matches, sellotape, string and elastic bands. There was a tea-light some distance away. Without getting any closer, they had to light the tea-light using the equipment provided.

The next week the Cubs in their sixes were given a sheet containing various signs, symbols and pictures and they had to identify as many as they could.

We visited the Kailash Buddhist Centre in Bidston Road in Oxton, to learn about Buddhism and its ceremonies and meditation.

The last Cubs before half term they did camp fire cooking and cooked hot dogs wrapped in pizza dough, this was followed by roasting marshmallows to make s'mores.

June 2023

After the half term break the Cubs had a night of sailing on West Kirby Lake. A great night was had by all.

Between both packs 521 badges have been awarded in the last 12 months and 5 chief scout silver awards

For the Spring/Summer term we are starting to prepare the Scouts for summer camp which will be a back to basics/survival theme. We have already looked at fire lighting, working safely with axes, knives and saws. Currently we are working on navigation.

Some of the Scouts attended the first County Expedition weekend in which they passed their expedition challenge badge. We also attended the District Orienteering Competition and had some very creditable performances.



Thor & Royden Colony report 2022/23

Since September the Beavers have taken part in a variety of activities. On our first night back in September, we joined in with the Group event at the Maize Maze in Brimstage, we have had a visit from Helen and Angie the Bee ladies who came to talk about bees and bee keeping and the equipment that is used, which the Beavers all tried on!! this was an interesting evening. They have learnt how to make a phone call, send a text message and email. The Beavers have learnt how to spell their name using Morse code and work out a simple message, this was for the Communicator badge. They have completed the Readers badge, by designing a cover for their favourite book, making a bookmark and explaining what they are used for and how to look after their books.

We have visited the Teams4U warehouse in Birkenhead where the Beavers helped by packing Christmas shoeboxes, which were going to children in deprived countries. They also learnt about the different countries by watching a DVD. They brought in their own Christmas Shoebox which they had packed at home.

The Beavers have learnt about Remembrance and wrote their own prayers, plus made a large Poppy wreath which was on display at St Bartholomew's Church, Thurstaston. We attended the service on the following Sunday.

We have painted pottery at the Potting shed in Hoylake, made Christmas stockings and Reindeer decorations. Attended the District Beaver Nativity Service where 5 of our Beavers had a part to play.

On our first night back after Christmas we held a Lego night where each Beaver brought in a container of Lego and built a futuristic machine. We also said goodbye to Bella and wished her all the best as she moves on to Cubs for her next Scouting adventure.

We have had a visit to Heswall Fire station, the Beavers enjoyed looking around the Fire engine and sitting in it, needless to say, the best part of their evening was squirting water from the hoses. At the end of the evening, they had a talk on fire safety.

Over the next couple of weeks, they learnt about Health and Fitness by taking part in different Agility games, they made a fruit kebab, and discussed different food groups (not so healthy and healthy), made posters promoting healthy eating; these can be seen on the wall in the Scout hut and had a fantastic Fitness night, which was run by Helen (aka Sunshine).

The Beavers have completed their Cooks badge, by learning about kitchen hygiene and safety, food hygiene, they have made French bread Pizza's with different toppings - pineapple, pepperoni, chicken and sweetcorn, and they made chocolate crispy cakes.

They have learnt what to pack for a camp or sleepover and they have made card vases containing daffodils for Mother's Day.

The Beavers have learnt about different Disability's, how to push a wheelchair safely, they have guided each other blindfolded around an assault course, they have talked about different equipment that can assist a Disabled person. We had a visit from Sue with Guide

dog Sparkie, and she spoke to the Beavers about the work that the Guide dogs do to help a blind person, this was a very interesting night and the Beavers asked lots of questions. They learnt how to Fingerspell their name and the Beaver Promise.

The Beavers have enjoyed an Easter egg hunt. Learnt how to tie their shoelaces, reef knot and a bowline. They had an Experiment night, with 4 experiments- volcano, Candle, Skittles & water surface tension.

We talked about what plants need to grow, the tools that we use and the different seasons. The Beavers then planted a sunflower and herb seed and have taken them home to look after and record the seeds growth, this is to be returned in 2 months' time.

We have been on a Nature and Minibeast hike in Harrock wood in Irby. We are now learning how to look after our pets and the wildlife, the Beavers have made Fat balls to hang up in their gardens and are recording what birds they can spot in their garden. They will also be making bug hotels.

I would like to thank my leader team, Helen and Gregg, also my Young Leaders Nia, Sam, Gabe and Joe for all their help. I would also like to thank all of my parents for their help and support over the year.
