Complete 18 nights away as an Explorer Scout or a member of the Scout Network of which 12 must be camping

### INTERNATIONAL, ENVIRONMENTAL AND VALUES LIST

Complete 2 activities from the list

### CHALLENGES

Complete the 5 Queen's Scout Award challenges which comprise ***Skill, Physical Activity, Service, Expedition, and Residential.***

### PRESENTATION

Make a presentation, to a suitable audience, of your achievements in working towards the Queen's Scout Award
